TEAM PROJECT for CSC 302, Turner Spring 2012

Each team will make some sort of presentation (not a lecture by powerpoint slides!) to the class designed to teach us all something valuable about Computers and Society. It can be a short play, a poetry reading, musical, a YouTube video you've prepared, ... limited only by your imagination. The presentation must be 5 minutes to a maximum of 7 minutes in length and will be subjectively graded on the following metrics:

- relevance of content to Computers and Society (7)
- clarity of the lesson conveyed (7)

- originality of the approach (giving basic lessons an entirely new context can be very useful and interesting!) (7)

The grade is 21 (out of 20 :-) points of your 100 total of the final grade. My basic rubric, utilizing the above qualities, will be, for each metric:

below 3 : very poor work4-5 : fair work6 : good work7 : most excellent work

Each team member is expected to receive an identical grade, based on the overall team grade. To that end, every presentation must be accompanied by a <u>REPORT that</u> contains a minimum of the following:

- 1. Team Name
- 2. Date of Presentation
- 3. Title of Presentation
- 4. One paragraph (minimum) summary of the presentation

5. Credits: a list of each team member's name and contribution to the team effort. Give enough detail that I can assess rough equality of participation. I will respect team claims of "fully cooperative" effort but may inquire of each member as to the accuracy of such claims.

The team presentations will need to be scheduled in the last two weeks of classes, each member is expected to be present to participate on the day scheduled.
