- Example Scenarios
  - Copying proprietary software
  - Data Mining
  - "Freedom" of expression
  - Male dominated game writing team ("responsibility") (end here 4/4)

Some Questions Raised

- If we *can*, then we *should*?
- If it is not against the *law*, then we've done nothing wrong.
- What abstractions may be *owned*?
- Is human weakness legitimately exploitable?
  - and what is the difference between "weakness" and "intention"?
  - human imperfection and human immorality?

Computing and Social Policy

- Have computers caused *new* problems?
- Have computers enhanced *old* problems?
- Have computers had little effect on basic human problems?
  - broad issue list raised by computing
  - broad issue list untouched by computing

"Vacuum" of Policies

- New possibilities imply New Risks
  - What to do when the new risks are realized?
- Trajectory of new risks?
  - Realization of new risks ahead of conceptualization and planning?

Traditionalist Account

- Define this term carefully
  - Where does it work well?
  - Where does it *not* work well?
- Descriptive and Normative Accounts
  - Define "descriptive"
  - Define "normative"
  - Distinguish the two terms
  - Shades of Requirements Analysis :-)
